Cast Biographies

Andy Belt (Billy Bibbit) is excited to be returning to Vagabond Players for his third show this season. Earlier in the season, he was in *Stop Kiss* and *Broadway Bound*. In recent years at Vagabonds, Andy performed in *12 Angry Jurors* and *Brighton Beach Memoirs*. In Baltimore, Andy has appeared in productions of *Much Ado About Nothing* and *The Mousetrap* at Spotlighters Theatre and *The Mineola Twins* at Fells Point Corner Theatre. Previously, he earned a degree in theater from Wake Forest University.

Stephen M. Deininger (R.P. McMurphy/Sound Design) is a prolific director, actor, and pianist across the Baltimore area. He is a board member with Vagabond Players and has been onstage as an actor and pianist in *The Complete Works of William Shakespeare (abridged)*, *The Fantasticks, The Pillowman, Little Shop of Horrors, Avenue Q, Cabaret, Our Town*, and directed of *God of Carnage, Talk Radio*, and *The Crucible*. He is the music director of Channing Memorial Church. He founded the Pandemic Players, an online theatrical performing group that raised funds to support local theaters during the early days of the COVID-19 pandemic, a project that spurred many similar regional companies and was covered by local media and theater trade publications around the world. During the early months of 2020, he and his wife started building a home recording studio to record hymns for churches adapting to online worship, and where they now record music under the group name Scotch and Lies.

John Dignam (Dale Harding) last traipsed across the Vagabond Players' stage as Rogers in the 2019 production of *And Then There Were None*. Since late 2015, he has worked with several other Baltimore area troupes and has appeared in more than two dozen productions to date. He is scheduled next to reprise his roles in a revival of Dan Rodricks' *Baltimore, You Have No Idea* at the Baltimore Museum of Art in December 2023 (baltimoreyouhavenoidea.com). John would like to thank Audra, Kerry, and the entire cast and crew for their support.

Adam Garrison (Chief Bromden) originally from Sarasota, Florida, is a stand-up comedian with over a decade of experience. In his travels, Adam has performed improv, stand-up comedy, and acted in venues all over the east coast. Past credits include *The Boys Next Door* and *Sordid Lives*. This is Adam's second portrayal of Chief Bromden and his first production with the Vagabond Players.

Lauren Jackson (Nurse Ratched) is thrilled to be back on the Vagabond Players' stage, having previously performed as Mrs. Putnam in *The Crucible* in 2019. Favorite past roles include Rosalie Mullins in *School of Rock: The Musical* at Landless Theater Company, Catherine in *Proof*, Maria in *The Sound of Music*, Annie Sullivan in *The Miracle Worker*, and Cathy in *The Last Five Years*, all in her home state of West Virginia. Favorite current roles

include mom to amazing 10-year-old Lily and fiance to brilliant and beautiful (age-redacted) Tim. Three years has been a long time to wait to play this deliciously devilish character and she is beyond proud to get to do it with this incredible cast and crew.

Lillian Jackson (Voiceover) is very excited to be a part of her second grown-up play, having just appeared as Marta von Trapp in *The Sound of Music* with 2nd Star Productions in Bowie. She loved getting to hang out and make this recording with one of her favorite people, Mr. Steve. She is very proud of her mom, who is playing Nurse Ratched.

Ari Juno (they/them/theirs) (Candy Starr) is so thrilled to be performing in their third production with Vagabond Players, having portrayed George in *Stop Kiss* and The Mute in *The Fantasticks*. Ari does a lot of work with little theaters around Baltimore. Selections from their resume include: Millie Martindale in *Perfect Arrangement* and Pimple/Stingo in *She Stoops to Conquer* at Fells Point Corner Theatre, Pompey Bum et al in *Measure for Measure* at Green Globe Theatre, Leslie Casewell in *The Mousetrap*, as well as originating the role of Teddy, the protagonist of *Riot Brrrain* at the 2018 Capital Fringe Festival. They have also worked as a puppeteer with the Baltimore Rock Opera Society.

Nate Krimmel (Aide Warren) is a local Baltimore actor and is ecstatic to be making his Vagabond Players debut. The History of VAGABOND PLAYERS

The years that followed the great fire of 1904 were a time of great bustle and activity for Baltimore, and the commencement of World War I in 1914 helped to intensify this mood. During 1915 and 1916, Baltimore's industrial growth surpassed that of any similar period. [Also] during the war, a renaissance in the arts took place, led by Baltimore's mayor, Walter Preston. In 1915 Preston told the city council, "Baltimore's citizens have as much right to organizations that provide for aesthetic development as they do to a sanitation department."

Thus, by 1916 the city had its own symphony and community park concerts, and work had begun on a public art museum. Curiously enough, though, no one had been able to establish any kind of successful, progressive theater. This seems especially odd when one considers the great theatrical ferment that was then sweeping the country. Despite this national movement, however, attempts to organize permanent dramatic groups in Baltimore had failed. In 1916, three people decided to alter this situation: Constance D'Arcy Mackay, a New Yorker who specialized in directing elaborate pageants; Adele Gutman Nathan, a Baltimorean who had directed plays while attending Goucher College; and Carol Sax, a former student of theater and art at Columbia University and teacher at the Maryland Institute of Art.

In 1947, Mrs. Nathan recalled the circumstances that led to the founding of Baltimore's first little theater:

Constance Mackay, Carol Sax and I were waiting for a streetcar at the corner of Charles and Centre Streets...Weary from rehearsal, we leaned against a store window while we talked — good talk about the Little Theatre Movement that was spreading across the country...We agreed that Baltimore should have a Little Theatre. The town was loaded with talent. The question was, where to put the playhouse.

Carol Sax noticed that Miss Mackay and I were leaning against a store window. Directly above our heads was sign, "For Rent—Apply St. James Hotel." Eagerly the three of us cupped our eyes with our hands and peered through the darkened glass. The store was empty. It was about two stories high, just right for a theatre, and by some miracle there was a raised platform across the back wall...

Early the next morning, Carol Sax went to the St. James Hotel and paid the first month's rent. \$19.

Constance MacKay did not remain in Baltimore to participate in the actual founding of the theater. However, Carol Sax and Mrs. Nathan proceeded enthusiastically with the project, managing to throw Baltimore into a tizzy of excitement with their oblique publicity.
